



WORD FROM THE CHAIRMAN

The year 2019 was a major step in Tanger Med's development.

On Friday $28^{\rm th}$ June, Crown Prince Moulay El Hassan, represented His Majesty King Mohammed VI, at the launching ceremony of the port operations of the new Tanger Med 2 port.

A platform that has now positioned Tanger Med as the first port capacity in the Mediterranean.

This new port, with a public-private investment of 25 billion dhs, represents the third phase of development the Tanger Med port complex, alongside the Tanger Med 1 port and the Passengers & Ro-Ro port.

Tanger Med 2 port, by increasing its capacity by an additional 6 million containers, has further strengthened the position of Tanger Med port complex, with a total capacity of more than 9 million containers, as a reference hub in Africa and in the world in terms of logistics flows and international trade.

This achievement reflects the pertinency of the original Vision of His Majesty the King for this strategic project and the Sovereign's judicious choice of its location on the Strait, at the crossroads of maritime routes.

As far as port traffic is concerned, the year 2019 has enabled Tanger Med to reach a new milestone with more than 4.8 million containers, growing by + 38%, and more than 65 million tons of goods handled. Tanger Med port has also handled 357 214 trucks, 500 465 new vehicles, and 2 775 402 passengers.

On the industrial side, 2019 was marked by the implementation of 125 new industrial projects across all Tanger Med's activity zones, representing private investments of 5.1 billion dirhams and 11 570 new jobs.

To date, nearly 1000 companies have now set up in all the Tanger Med activity zones, operating in the port, industrial, logistics and service sectors and generating more than 80 000 direct jobs.

This development strengthens both Moroccan and continental logistics competitiveness and contributes to promoting Morocco's role as a major player in global logistics corridors.


At the same time, and as part of a coherent and proactive CSR approach, Tanger Med has placed sustainability at the heart of its priorities.

In addition, Tanger Med through its foundation continued its involvement in the fields of education, health, training and socio-cultural issues for human and territorial development.

In 2019, the Foundation implemented 110 projects and actions benefiting more than 61 560 beneficiaries, such as the clean beaches programme, the continuation of the project to connect villages to the drinking water network, the construction of pre-school units, and the opening up of art and culture through workshops for children in rural areas.

The financial aggregates confirmed the performance of the Tanger Med group, which maintains its profitability objectives, with a group turnover of MAD 3.4 billion, up + 15% and a net income of MAD 918 million.

These performances are the result of the continuous commitment of Tanger Med's employees and partners, who, through their envolument, work daily for the success of this reference project that is a national pride.



TANGER MEDITERRANEAN SPECIAL AGENCY

By announcing on 30 July 2002, on the occasion of the Throne Speech, the decision to build a «large structuring, port, commercial and industrial complex on the shores of the Straits, to the East of Tangier», His Majesty King Mohammed VI brought Morocco in a long-term project punctuated by the progressive commissioning of the various infrastructures of the complex, opening the way for each future project to new prospects, thus boosting the development and competitiveness of the Moroccan economy.

Beyond the construction of the port infrastructure, it is a matter of building and managing an integrated project with multiple dimensions, both economic and territorial.

Anchored to the world trade flows, the success of Tanger Med is also conditioned from its conception to the capacity of the port to set up a project that meets the standards of its competitors, the world's major ports, industrial and logistics platforms.

The scale of the challenges., the determination to meet the commitments on time, and the obligation to control costs and impacts on the territory have led the Moroccan government to initiate an innovative model of governance with the creation in 2003 of an ad hoc structure: the Tanger Mediterranean Special Agency (TMSA)

It is a public limited company with an executive board and a supervisory board, in which government ministers and heads of the public entities concerned sit.

In charge of the development, planning and management of the Tanger Med industrial-port complex, the Agency has been endowed with public prerogatives and missions related to port authority and free zones' management, in application and continuity of the provisions of ordinary law on the subject.

The governance system put in place by the government is one of the key components in achieving these ambitious and strategic objectives.

Moreover, the level of interest in the Tanger Mediterranean Special Agency's mechanism at the international level is one of the most convincing signs of the relevance of the approach adopted.



All of TMSA's prerogatives are set by Decree-Law No. 2-02-644 of 2 rajeb 10-

1423 September 2002) establishing the Tanger Mediterranean

Special development zone. In this context, the Moroccan State has entrusted TMSA with the following main missions:

- All technical and economic studies relating to the port and free zones
- Implementing a general development plan for the Special Development Zone
- Contributing to the research and mobilisation of the necessary funding to carry out the components of the Tanger Med project

- Development and operation of the new port and areas of logistics, industrial, commercial and tourist activity
- Commercial promotion of the port and business areas
- Concession, where applicable, of activities at the port and free zones
- •Administration of the public domain of the Special Development Zone
- Management of the port by carrying out the Authority's missions







A WORLD CLASS PORT COMPLEX

Tanger Med port complex aims to develop an efficient and truly integrated port complex around the complementary activities of transhipment, import-export, value-added logistics, and maritime and port services.

Tanger Med port complex covers 1,000 ha and includes:

Tanger Med port 1, which has two container terminals, a railway terminal, an oil terminal, a general cargo terminal and a vehicle terminal

Tanger Med port 2, which includes two container terminals.

Tanger Med Passengers and Ro-Ro Port which includes border access and inspection areas, docks passenger and TIR embarkation areas, control areas, and the ferry terminal.

The Logistics Zone, which ultimately covers an area of 200 ha, is intended for activities value-added logistics, consolidation, distribution and supply.

Tanger Med Port Center: Tanger Med's business centre, with a covered area of 29,000 m², is the main place of exchange for the maritime and port community.

1st port in Africa since 2017, Tanger Med has become, thanks to the Tanger Med 2 port, the 1st port capacity in the Mediterranean, and is committed to the integration of the top 20 platforms worldwide.

In addition to being the 1st port in Morocco, Tanger Med is the 1st Moroccan platform for import / export flows.

In 2019 Tanger Med handled more than 65 million tonnes of goods.

Tanger Med port provides, through several shipowners, regular connections serving more than 180 ports and 70 countries across the 5 continents. As the hub of Africa, it serves nearly 40 ports and 22 countries in West Africa with weekly connections.


More than a port, Tanger Med complex is an integrated logistics platform, connected to a multimodal transport network (rail links, motorways and expressways) for the transport of goods and people to all the economic regions of the Kingdom.


The operation of the terminals and of all port activities is carried out under concession contracts by world-renowned operators. The port of Tanger Med thus boasts the world's largest shipping lines (Maersk, CMA-CGM, MSC, Hapag-lloyd, Arkas...) as well as port leaders such as APM TERMINALS and EUROGATE. The vision of Tanger Med port is part of a sustainable development approach seeking a balance between economic, environmental and social aspects.


In this perspective, an environmental management system has been implemented, making Tanger Med port the first Moroccan port to be certified. ISO 14001 for the "Reception of ships and associated port services" perimeter, and the first African port to obtain the "ECOPORTS" and "PERS" labels issued by "The European Sea Ports Organisation".


OVERALL PLAN OF THE COMPLEX

NEW VEHICLES ACTIVITY

Tanger Med's new vehicle activity, which is operational since 2012, takes place at the car carrier terminal which has an annual handling capacity of 1,000,000 new vehicles and is subdivided into two vehicle terminals: the Renault Vehicle Terminal (TVR) and the Multi-User Vehicle Terminal (TVCU).

RENAULT VEHICLE TERMINAL

Renault's vehicle terminal covers an area of 13 Ha with a nominal storage capacity of 6,000 vehicles. It handles the annual production of 400,000 vehicles produced by the Renault Melloussa plant.

This terminal has two docks that can accommodate the latest generation of vessels (up to 240 m in length and 12 m in depth).

The terminal manages the following activities:

- . Embarkation and disembarkation of vehicles (ships)
- . Loading and unloading of vehicles (trains, and trucks)
- . Upkeep, maintenance and renewal of material / equipment and port superstructures
- . Handling and storage of transshipment vehicles within the perimeter of the terminal's median.

COMMON VEHICLE TERMINAL USER

Adjacent to that of Renault and spreading over an area of 5.5 ha, with a storage capacity of 3,000 vehicles, the multi-user vehicle terminal has the same pier including two quays that can accommodate latest-generation cargo

vessels (up to 240 m length), as well as technical and administrative buildings to offer quality services for vehicles for export or transhipment such as PSA, Nissan, Ford, Fiat, Honda, Hyundai etc.

The port authority has entrusted GSTM (STVA Tanger Med Group), within the framework of a sub-contracting contract, with the handling activities in the multi-user vehicle terminal of the Tanger Med port. The multi-user vehicle terminal has been operational since March 2013.

VEHICLE RAILWAY TERMINAL

The vehicle railway terminal has 4 tracks with a usable length of 240 m allowing for the handling of half a bay per track and an unloading platform. This terminal is used to handle trains for export from the Renault Melloussa plant and the PSA Kenitra plant, and is thus connected to the national rail network. Each train of vehicles can carry up to 280 vehicles.

Today, the vehicle terminal is connected by regular lines to the ports of Le Haure, Montoir, Fos Sur Mer, Piraeus, Zeebrugge, Barcelona, Livorno, Constanta, Koper, Borusan. Tunis, Alexendria and Ilyichevsk, Durban, Abu dhabi, Jebel Ali, Vera cruz, Brisbane, Kembia...

The year 2019 was marked by the start of exports of PSA vehicles through the port of Tanger Med from the Kenitra plant.

PASSENGER ACTIVITY

Tanger Med port has a handling capacity of 7,000,000 passengers per year. It is equipped with 8 berths dedicated to passengers, two access and border inspection zones (to enter and exit Morocco), boarding zones and a ferry terminal.

PASSENGER VEHICLES

The car passenger circuit benefits from infrastructures allowing the physical separation of vehicle traffic at the entrance and exit, doubling handling capacity, and optimising user transit times under the best safety and security conditions.

Indeed, the control zones at the "Automobile Access" level are equipped with all the services required by users: they include green areas, a catering service, ticket sales counters, a prayer area, sanitary facilities, a large screen for instant display of departure and arrival times, of ships, and benefit from large shaded areas.

A storage area for vehicles waiting to access the port has been created to avoid traffic congestion on busy days. An area of 1.8 ha has been set up as a port regulation zone, and equipped with the services necessary to wait for passengers in the best and most comfortable conditions. The control formalities are carried out from the vehicles.

For passengers arriving in Morocco, passports are stamped on board ships. Likewise, the temporary admission of means of transport for import and whose usual residence is abroad, is processed by the computer system of the customs administration on board ships.

ACCESS AND BORDER INSPECTION ZONE (MOROCCAN EXIT) INCLUDING

- 34 police checkpoints allowing the processing of 1,000 vehicles per hour
 6 customs control offices for passenger vehicles
- A 3,000 m² covered area dedicated to vehicle searches
- Dedicated coach access
- A car park with a capacity of 500 vehicles
- A covered pedestrian zone for the purchase of tickets, sanitary facilities, café, prayer room
- 8 check-in points without drop-off for passengers with existing tickets

The design and organisation of this space allows for the fluidity of the traffic and the limitation of the passage time per vehicle. The booths are equipped with fibre optic connections. A mobile scanner search zone allows non-intrusive control by reducing passenger waiting time.

ACCESS AND BORDER INSPECTION ZONE (MOROCCO ENTRY) INCLUDING

- 16 police checkpoints for passenger vehicles allowing the handling of 500 vehicles per hour without the passenger getting out of the vehicle
- 5 customs control offices for passengers in their vehicles
- A covered area of 1,000 m² dedicated to vehicle searches, and adjoining 900 m² of administrative buildings and zones for customs and police officers in charge of control.
- An infirmary and an office dedicated to the Mohammed V Foundation for Solidarity
- 5 customs control offices for passengers in their vehicles
- Sanitation
- Dedicated coach access
- A mobile scanner search zone enabling non-intrusive screening and reducing passenger waiting time.

PEDESTRIAN PASSENGERS

Pedestrian passengers access the Tanger Med Passenger port through the Tanger Med Port Center giving direct access to the ferry terminal. Police and customs controls are carried out within the Maritime Station.

Upon arrival, passports are stamped on board the ships during the crossing. The interport shuttle service ensures the transfer of pedestrian passengers directly from the disembarkation zone to the ferry terminal and vice versa.

A taxi, bus and train service is available to pedestrian passengers for their transfer to Tanger Med.

Coaches also access Tanger Med Port Passengers through Tanger Med Port Center. Police and customs checks of coach passengers are carried out at the ferry terminal. The ferry terminal includes a border control area, a pre-boarding waiting room, cafeterias, a passenger arrival hall, shuttles to and from the boarding platforms, services (reception, ticket office, bank, exchange office, restaurant, kiosk, infirmary, sanitary facilities, prayer room...), as well as a railway station with 2 passenger platforms and a bus station of 7.500 m² with 9 bus and coach spaces. The ferry terminal is also equipped with escalators, lifts, quick-charging stations for mobile phones and screens displaying ship departure and arrival times.

PRE-BOARDING ZONE

The pre-boarding zones in the port have rest areas to improve the comfort of passengers during their transits. These areas are operated by professionals and include cafes, restaurants, duty free shops, medical facilities, children's play areas and terraces with views over the entire port. A service building at the preembarkation level, including offices of the shipping companies, Mohammed V Foundation offices, police offices, sanitary blocks, refreshment stands, Royal Gendarmerie offices.





APM TERMINALS

TC1 concessionnaire

The first container terminal (TC1) to be operated under a 30year concession granted to the company in 2005 at APM Terminals Handler. The terminal has 1860 Tangier, a subsidiary of the APM Terminals Group, one of the world leaders in container terminal management.

Terminal TC1 is equipped with 10 Super Post Panamax Gantries (61T lifting capacity), 23 Wheel Gantries (RTG), 72 Truck Tractor Terberg (TTT), 76 Trailor containers as well as 2 Reach Stacker and 7 Empty

sockets for Reefer containers.

The investment in superstructure and equipment for TC1 amounted to more than 150 million USD.

The terminal has an 18 m draught, enabling it to receive the world's largest container ships, in particular Maersk-Line's triple E class ships.

Since 2008, TC1 has been performing at productivity levels of the highest international standards (more than 30 movements per hour per gantry) with non-stop operations in 24h/365d, allowing TC1 to ensure an annual handling capacity level of more than 1.5 Million TEU.

TC4 concessionnaire


The world leader APM TERMINALS is developing the TC4 container terminal in Tanger Med under a concession contract. This is the 2nd terminal operated by the world leader AP Moller - Maersk at the port complex.

The TC4 terminal is dedicated to the world's first maritime alliance led by Maersk Line. This terminal is the most innovative in Africa, and integrates the latest generation equipment for container movement.

The private investment made is 1,2 Billion USD for the terminal, the development of the container storage platforms, the superstructures as well as the terminal management equipment at the quays delivered by Tanger Med.

The terminal has a quay length of 2,000 m, a surface area of 58.5 HA and is equipped with 12 latest-generation cranes capable of handling the world's largest container carriers, 30 Shuttle Carriers and 42 ARMG's.

EUROGATE TANGER

TC2 concession holder

The second container terminal (TC2) is operated under a 30-year concession granted in 2006 to the EUROGATE TANGER consortium, Contship Italia, Europe's leading port operator and leader to the shipping companies MSC and CMA-CGM, respectively the 2nd and 3rd largest container carriers in the world.

The second TC2 container terminal, which came into service in July 2008, is operated by Eurogate Tanger.

The TC2 terminal is a multi-user terminal and accommodates the largest ship owners CMA-CGM/ Delmas, Hapag-lloyd, Arkas. Since the start of operations, the Common User terminal has seen the number of its ship owners increase from 2 to 18 by the end of 2018.

In addition to a depth of -18 m, the second TC2 container terminal is equipped with 8 Super Post Panamax type quayside gantry cranes (61T lifting capacity), 1 mobile crane (Gottwald), 23 wheel gantry cranes, 36 trucks, 36 40inch chassis, refrigerated container

storage gantry cranes, 6 Reach Stacker and 1 Empty Handler.

The investment in superstructure and equipment for TC2 amounted to more than 150 million USD. TC2 achieves outputs of productivity levels in line with international standards.



HORIZON TANGIER TERMINAL

Hydrocarbon terminal concessionaire

HTTSA «Horizon Tangier Terminal SA» is the concession holder of the hydrocarbons terminal. Its shareholders are the companies Horizon Terminal Ltd, subsidiary of the ENOC group (Dubai), Akwa Group (Morocco) and Independent Petroleum Group (Kuwait).

The terminal has the following infrastructures:

- 2 berths 3 km from the terminal to receive ships
- 6 pipes produced with a diameter
- of 20" (2 pipes) and 16" (4 pipes) - 112" pipe for fire water
- 1 truck loading station
- 1 wagon loading station



Vehicle terminal concession holder

The port authority has awarded a 30-year concession contract to Renault for the design, financing, construction, operation and maintenance of the vehicle terminal.

Renault subcontracted handling in the vehicle terminal to the operator GSTM (Geodis STVA Tanger Méditerranée).

The towing at Port Tanger Med 1 is carried out by the company BOLUDA, with a fleet of 4 identical tugs of ASD type (Azimuth Stern Drive) built by the DAMEN shipyards in the Netherlands.

The tugs VB MALABATA, VB CIRES, VB DALIA and VB SPARTEL provide towing and assistance 24/7.

They have a 3700 KW machine power and a towing capacity of 60

These twin tugs, 28.67 metres long and 10.43 metres wide, are equipped with fire-fighting equipment meeting FI-FI «Fire-Fighting 1» standards. They are also equipped with anti-pollution devices.

The agility and performance of the operations are essential to offer a quality and competitive service in

order to satisfy our customers; BOLUDA's port towage services are therefore ISO 9001/2008 and ISM code (International Safety Management) certified in order to guarantee operations based on the highest international quality and safety standards.

SVITZER

The international towing operator SVITZER has been providing safety and support at sea since 1833. A member of the Maersk Group, this world leader in the towing and emergency response market provides towing services at Port Tanger Med 2.

A fleet of 4 identical tugs of the latest generation, built in the SANMAR shipyard in Turkey are mobilised 24/7 to contribute to the performance and fluidity of port operations.

SVITZER AL HOCEIMA, SVITZER CHEFCHAOUEN and SVITZER TETOUAN have an overall length of 29.4 metres and a width of 13.3 metres.

These RASTAR 2900 type units are equipped with a towing

capacity of 90 tons and an ASD propulsion (Azimuth Stern Drive) with Schottel Z-Drive with a machine power of 5400 KW in compliance with IMO Tier II



A COMMITMENT TO DIGITIZATION TO FACILITATE EXPORT AND LOGISTICS COMPETITIVENESS



Tanger Med has been actively involved in a digitization process since the start of its activity. For a decade, IT services and solutions have multiplied, offering a range of digital services to the port community and port users, thus strengthening their logistics competitiveness.

As a global logistics hub with international standards, Tanger Med operates its own Port Community System (PCS) that meets international standards and requirements. This PCS is at the service of maritime partners, logisticians, transporters and industrialists. It allows fully dematerialised centralised transactions, integrated into the system of control bodies, for the management of import and export operations.

Tanger Med Port Community System has been designed to improve administrative and operational efficiency, export facilitation and the competitiveness of all users of the port complex.

Tanger Med is fully engaged in a continuous process to improve its service offer in the port logistics and industry sector, and to create links between the port and the activity zones.

Tanger Med Port Community System enables to meet the following requirements:

- Connect the stakeholders of the port and logistics chain
- Manage and automate processes efficiently

- Optimize supply chains through intelligent and instantaneous exchange of information with stakeholders
- Make national and international logistics chains more attractive thanks to a single access platform.

Wide range of services

Tanger Med Port Community System offers digital services to facilitate maritime, port, import and export operations and hinterland connections. All port activities are involved, including container traffic, trucks, liquid bulk, dry bulk and new vehicles. Several modules are operational in Tanger Med Port Community System, including:

MARITIME

Paperless stopover management

The management of maritime calls at the Tanger Med port is entirely dematerialised. The shipping agent, through the Port Community System, requests to the harbour master's office for the allocation of a berth (reservation, update or cancellation), and provides digitally through the portal all the documents of the port of call (entry declaration, crew list, health declaration, ISPS declaration, dangerous goods manifest, passenger list, cargo manifest, MARPOL declaration etc...).

Through the port community system, the ship's agent can also make requests for additional services, such as the request for a port of call certificate, the request for the hiring of a pilot, the request for deballasting or works, etc.

The Port Community System also allows ship owners to benefit from a system of management of call priorities and a firm reservation system. These services enable the optimisation of the sea port of call, systemic prioritisation, and improved performance by reducing fuel costs and waiting times in the port.

Finally, the port community system makes it possible to consult other types of information such as the ship rotation programme, information on the technical characteristics of the port or the Berth plan.


Management of the order of ship movements

This module allows the implementation of the continuous exchange resources between the different actors of the port (terminal operators, harbour master's office, shipowners...) in order to optimise the management of port movements. In fact, given the significant increase in the number of calls recorded by the port, it has become necessary to set up accompanying measures to minimise waiting times for ship owners, hence this participative approach between all the actors in order to detect the ways of improvement and to understand the constraints of each entity.

Stopouer slot reservation system

Tanger Med Port Community System has integrated a new slot reservation module designed to handle the port movements of a special category of vessels within Tanger Med complex. Its purpose is to allow these large ships to reserve slots during which they have absolute priority for the execution of their movements (Berthing or Disembarkation). The solution is accessible to all stakeholders (Terminals, Shipowners, Consignment Agents) from Tanger Med Port Community System. The aim is to:

- Improve the safety of maritime traffic in Tanger Med port area
- Better plan port movements
- Optimise the resources of maritime services.





PORT OPERATIONS

Commissioning of a new container flow regulation system «Gate-in Gate-out».

Tanger Med port has set up a «Gate-in/Gate-out» container flow regulation system for the access of trucks and containers to the terminals.

This new system which integrates shipping lines, carriers and terminal operators aims to:

- Rationalize and better plan the arrival of trucks in the port area and ensure better planning and proper regulation of container traffic in the port, helping to make land operations more efficient, transparent and predictive
- Avoid congestion of facilities in the port
- Ensure better planning of operations

At terminals

- Improve service and processing times for customers
- Reduce the security risk for people and goods, both in terms of the SAS, the port perimeter and the container terminal gates,
- Control the movements of empty flatbed trucks in the port.

An EDI interface between the Tanger Med Information system and the shipping line systems has been set up to automatically retrieve authorization notifications for the deposit or removal of containers. For shipping lines not yet ready to integrate this mode of exchange, a front office module will be made available to them via the Tanger Med Port Community System.

Terminal operators will proceed via the same platform by validating authorization requests issued by shipping lines, possibly offering slots for carriers depending on the terminal's operational capacity.

In addition to improving the planning, transparency and efficiency of operations and the agility of supply chain management, this new system represents an important step in the process of digitizing port services offered by Tanger Med.


Digitization Of Port Freight Passage

Tanger Med is pursuing improvements related to facilitation through the dematerialization and automation of procedures. Companies operating in the freight sector can now complete new port clearance formalities in Tanger Med based on online declaration and electronic filing of documents with the Port Authority.

In parallel with the extended dematerialisation of customs declarations, these companies will benefit from a simplification of their procedures while guaranteeing a high level of security for the flow of goods.

- Document dematerialisation by integrating the electronic signature of documents (Document integration directly at the portal level and simplified declaration by automated loading of data from the DUM Unified Goods Declaration to Customs). This system will make the administrative procedures relating to the transit of goods lighter and more reliable
- Possibility to benefit from the remote taxation service (online via the Tanger Med Port Community System) with online access to invoices.

The dematerialization of foreign trade procedures initiated by Tanger Med improves the competitiveness of Moroccan exports through the port complex.



TRACK AND TRACE

Tanger Med Port Community System provides freight forwarders, exporters, carriers and importers with traceability information enabling them to follow the evolution of their freight units at the different control and processing points in all port zones and in real time.

The traceability system has been extended to Tanger Med's industrial and logistic activity zones to allow a real time follow-up of the freight units, the acceleration and fluidity of the inter-zone and port-zone flows.

- Management and traceability of incoming and outgoing goods to and from the activity zones in real time
- Management and traceability of inter and intra zone flows
- Reliability and transparency of information exchanges with the various players (Free Zones, Port, Logistics Operators, Customs, ...etc.).

FINANCIAL SERVICES


THE MULTICHANNEL ONLINE PAYMENT FEATURES ON THE TANGER MED SERVICES PORTAL

As part of its service digitization program for the logistics community, Tanger Med has set up a new multichannel payment service, allowing operators to pay their bills in dirham for the port crossing of their Freight units. This new payment method offers operators the possibility to pay their bills through the following various channels:

- E-banking (payment on the bank's website)
- M-banking (mobile payment)
- GAB (Automated Teller Machine)

Operators wishing to use this new product must access to the Tanger Med portal and select a basket of credits that they plan to pay. A payment code is automatically assigned to the basket in question. It will be used by the operator to make the payment through the various channels offered.

Once the payment transaction is confirmed, the corresponding payment is recorded and the bills in question are paid. Operators wishing to benefit from this new product must have, if not already, an account on Tanger Med Port Community System.



ACTIVITY ZONES

Generalization of the Gate Access solution for managing the good flows to all Tanger Med Activity Zones



Tanger Med Zones as a logistics and industrial platform integrated into a performant port platform, provide logistics operators with better competitiveness in terms of distribution chain management (freight cost, port handling, transit time...), quality infrastructures, and integrated logistics with the best international standards.

This logistical integration, which meets the fluidity, traceability and security requirements of logistics flows, is based on the use of the GATE ACCESS system allowing the following:

- Management and traceability of goods entering/exiting the free zones
- Management and traceability of inter / intra-zone flows,
- · Possibility of extracting relevant statistics on goods flows.
- Reliability and transparency of information exchanges with the different stakeholders (Free zones, Port, Logistics operators, Customs, etc.),
- · Cooperation with customs services in the port and free zones.

GATE ACCESS system experienced a major evolution during the last quarter, enabling the process of dematerialization and fluidification of freight unit handling to be accelerated by the automatic integration of the customs declaration (DUM) of flows coming from and to Tanger Med Zones.

CONTROL BODY

A new step forward for agri-food exports



In the framework of the digitization of Tanger Med's service offer through the implementation in its portal «Port Community System» of various solutions to strengthen the logistic competitiveness of exporters, a new step has been taken thanks to the partnership with Morocco Foodex for the facilitation of Moroccan exports for agro-food products.

This new solution will allow a dematerialised management of the export procedure of agrofood products, according to the requirements of Morocco Foodex, from the packaging, storage and manufacturing stations of the products throughout the Kingdom.

For instance, a citrus fruit exporter in the Agadir region will be able, thanks to their access accounts in the Morocco Foodex portal or in the «Tanger Med Port Community Sytem», to apply for the certification of conformity of their products for export, to consult the control results delivered by Morocco Foodex, and to generate in a dematerialised way the inspection certificate of their exports, from their production site.

Thanks to the automated exchange with control bodies and border crossing points, including the BADR system of the Customs and Indirect Taxes Administration, the inspection certificate can be provided automatically to obtain the customs clearance for shipment through Tanger Med port.

This solution confirms Tanger Med's ongoing commitment to improving the logistics competitiveness of Moroccan exporters.

THE PORT COMMUNITY'S BUSINESS CENTER


Tanger Med Port Center is located in the immediate vicinity of Tanger Med port 1, the passenger and ro-ro port and the logistics zone. As a catalyst for synergies between the port and tertiary trades, Tanger Med Port Center represents the vital centre of the Port Complex.

With a length of 450 m and a width of 50 m, it houses offices, an auditorium, a showroom and a living centre. This tertiary building accommodates all the port administrations and operators in a working and living environment. The Business Center is a gateway to the port complex for pedestrians and a multimodal meeting point with its maritime, rail and bus stations integrated within the basement of the building.

With two direct accesses to the Mediterranean Bypass linking Tangier to Saidia, via Fnideq and Tetouan, and to the Tangier/Casablanca motorway, Tanger Med Port Center is located in a 19-ha zone, built as the business district of the Tanger Med port complex.

Designed by the architect Jean Nouvel, in collaboration with the Moroccan architects' group Confluences, Tanger Med Port Center combines several styles: that of the Tangier and Arab world, with its massive and white treatment, with its patios and perforated facades according to geometrical patterns inspired by the moucharabiehs, that of the industrial port with its superstructure on stilts and that of the building respectful of its physical and ecological environment.






Tanger Med Port Center is made up of:

- A service area for travellers, a focal point of the business centre, it also provides various services to passengers (reception, ticketing, shops, fast food, etc.).
- Maritime station for the transit of pedestrian passengers to and from Europe, offering direct access to the different modes of transport (train, coach, taxi).
- \cdot A railway station with two passenger platforms providing the Tanger Med Tangier shuttle service
- A 7,350 m² bus station with a capacity of 20 bus stops and a stop area for taxis and shuttle buses of Tanger Med Port Complex.
- A life centre in sector 5: a place for catering and service to the public: post office, shops, bank agencies, insurance, car rental, travel agencies, pharmacy...
- The space also includes a Food-Court with 6 premises and a 3,000 m² esplanade overlooking the Tanger Med Port Complex and a 120 m² high-end restaurant with a Lounge.
- Offices, fitted out or being fitted out, with a total surface area of 30,500 m² (SHOB), occupying sectors 1.3, 4.6, 7 and 8.
- A 3-star hotel in sector 9
- · A 300-seat auditorium, equipped with projection and sound equipment and showroom spaces
- Parking spaces, with a total capacity of 600 spaces.

In 2008, with a view to optimising the operational efficiency of Tanger Med's two core businesses, the port and the activity zones, and to increase their development capacities, TMSA initiated a branching out process that led to the creation of a subsidiary dedicated to port activities, Tanger Med Port Authority SA.

In January 2010, Tanger Med Port Authority was transferred by decree-law all public missions and prerogatives relating to the management and development of the port complex and consequently acts as the Port Authority of Tanger Med Port.




Tanger Med Port Authority focuses its missions on the management and development of infrastructures, the coordination and animation of the port community and guarantees the reliability and performance of the services provided to the clients of the port platform.

Tanger Med Port Authority ensures the following functions:

- Construction and maintenance of port infrastructure (breakwaters, dredging and berthing works)
- Development of the port complex's activities and capacities
- · Licensing authority or direct operation of port terminals and activities of a public service nature
- $\bullet \quad \text{Organization and regulation of the relations and exchanges between the different stakeholders of the port community}$
- Promotion of Tanger Med port as a whole
- Port police function through the harbour master's office in charge of the safety and security of the complex.

Apart from the Tanger Med Passenger and Ro-Ro port, the main port activities of Tanger Med port complex are entrusted to private operators of national and international renown who, within the framework of concession contracts, invest in the port's superstructure and equipment and provide services complying with international standards of quality, safety and security.





TANGER MED 2 S.A IS A PUBLIC LIMITED COMPANY WITH A BOARD OF DIRECTORS, WITH A CAPITAL OF 5.1 BILLION DIRHAMS TM2 S.A IS IN CHARGE OF THE DEVELOPMENT, ASSET MANAGEMENT AND OPERATION ACTIVITIES OF THE PORT OF TANGER MED 2.

Tanger Med Port 2 is the third development phase of Tanger Med port complex, alongside Tanger Med Port 1 and the Passenger & Ro-Ro port.

The construction works of Tanger Med Port 2 started in May 2010 in accordance with the provisions of the construction contract, signed on June 17, 2009 during the official ceremony to launch the works, and are carried out in two phases:

- Phase I works, launched in 2010 and completed in 2016, comprise the basic infrastructure (including the main dike) and the first 1,200 linear metres of docks.
- Phase II works, which mainly include the new wharves (over 1600 linear metres) and the secondary dike

Tanger Med 2 port includes 4.8 km of dikes, a 160-hectare basin entirely reclaimed from the sea.

With a berthing capacity of 7 mega-container ships, the port totals 2.8 km of container docks with depths as low as -18 metres.

The Tanger Med 2 port, in its completed configuration, will contain two container terminals (TC3 and TC4).

Tanger alliance is the concessionaire of container terminal 3 (TC3). This terminal is characterized by a quay length of 800 m and a 34-hectare open area. The nominal capacity of the terminal is 1 million TEUs.

Terminal 4 (TC4), with a nominal capacity of 5 million TEUs, is conceded to APM TERMINALS, and is considered the most innovative terminal on the African continent. It integrates the latest container movement technologies, and is characterized by a quay length of 1,600 m extendible to 2,000 m and a total area of 76 hectares. The start of operational activities took place in June 2019.



MEDHUB A LOGISTICS ZONE

Launched in November 2008, and located within the Tanger Med port complex, the Logistics Zone managed by the Medhub company, is an ideal platform for the establishment of logistics bases to cover Europe, the Mediterranean and Africa.

Located in the immediate vicinity of the port via a single customs zone, the zone dedicated to value-added logistics activities, is at the heart of the region's business centers, allowing for fast and efficient distribution to a market of more than 1 billion consumers.

In addition to distribution activities, the zone is dedicated to logistics on the scale of global flows and constitutes a storage point for distribution to other free zones in Morocco as well a a release point for consumption on the subject territory.

With a surface area of 200 hectares, the Tanger Med logistics zone provides a full range of warehouses, offices and serviced bare land for rent, where value-added logistics operations such as labeling, packaging and inventory management can be carried out.

TANGER MED

AT THE HEART OF GLOBAL LOGISTICS

The transport and logistics sector is a major challenge for Tanger Med. Indeed, as it develops and plays its part in the global flows, Tanger Med is currently a logistics hub at the heart of global supply chains. Tanger Med's logistics offer is based on major assets:

Controlled real estate offer including ready-to-use warehouses dedicated to logistics and advanced stores

Multi-modality allowing the conversion and multiplexing of

Logistics operators and distributors have set up in Tanger Med logistics zone and offer complete services such as: value-added logistics for groupage, distribution and supply chain, order preparation, warehousing, packaging, labeling, and quality control.



VARIOUS LOGISTICS SERVICES



Logistics in Tanger Med generates a global business volume of 30 billion dhs. Tanger Med offers a complete range of services covering the entire supply chain for the processing of goods.

HANDLING

The Ro-Ro activity is carried out within the port facilities through the traction of trailers from the quay to the ships or from the ship to the quay, as well as for the transfer of pallets in the dedicated spaces. The container activity is carried out through the gantry and the gate inside the container terminals, whether it is for transhipment, cabotage or import-export containers.

The handling of vehicles is carried out by unloading the train/truck and then loading the ship, or the opposite: unloading the ship/truck and then loading the train/truck.

Finally, in the logistics area, the handling is carried out through the loading and unloading of container freight units and trucks to the storage area.

STORAGE

Tanger Med offers the possibility of storage and warehousing of goods awaiting export: in the dedicated regulation areas for truck, and in the Import Container Visiting Area (ICVA) for containers.

The ICVA is dedicated to facilitate the processing of container import operations at Tanger Med port and container terminals

The transhipment vehicles' storage is located in the terminal's median area. Finally, goods in the logistics zone are stored in a logistics area of nearly 400,000m² made up of rented warehouses and serviced bare land.



TRANSPORT

The Ro-Ro activity is the land transport of goods by trucks from Moroccan exporters (North / Central and South of Morocco) in the industry, textile and food processing sectors. The trucks then transport the goods by sea to Europe.

The container activity involves the transport of containers by land (from / to Northern Region / Centre and South of Morocco), the transport of containers by sea for cabotage (to / from other Moroccan ports), and the transport of containers by sea for transshipment.

The vehicle activity involves the transport of vehicles by rail from Renault Melloussa plant or by truck cars from SOMACA Casablanca plant.

Then comes the sea transport to destination.

The logistics activity is the transport of containers and trucks to the Medhub storage area and vice versa.







HISTORY AND DESCRIPTION

Tanger Med Industrial Platform, launched by His Majesty the King in January 2009, consisted in the development and deployment of several activity zones in the Strait region.

Tanger Med zones is the operational vehicle of Tanger Med Group, in charge of the planning, development and management of Tanger Med Industrial Platform; a land base estimated at 5,000 ha, mobilized around the port complex.

Within this industrial platform, logistics and service parks are developed, integrated into the port and managed according to the principle of one-stop shop, in accordance with the best international standards.

To date, this competitiveness hub has nearly 1,000 active export-oriented companies and more than 80,000 jobs mainly focused on industrial and logistics activities, operated by international players of reference in the aeronautics, automotive, textile, logistics and electronics sectors.

ASSETS

Tanger Med Zones, as an industrial platform connected to Tanger Med port complex, boasts significant assets. Indeed, it provides a valuable offer in line with the expectations of global players:

- A strategic location at the intersection of major maritime flows at the doors of target markets






The Renault plant in Tangier is dedicated to the production of Lodgy and Dokker, Dokker Van, Sandero and Sandero Stepway models, from stamping to assembly, sheet metal work and painting. The plant meets local and international demand for entry-level models. Its annual production capacity is expected to rapidly reach 400,000 vehicles per year.

The Renault plant has two production lines ranging from stamping to assembly, sheet metal, painting, seats and chassis, working with three production teams. Its annual production capacity set a record in 2017, reaching a volume of 273,176 vehicles. That same year, the Tangier plant exceeded 1 million vehicles produced since it began operations in 2012.

The Renault-Nissan plant is thus the largest automotive plant in Africa. Locally recruited employees are trained in the premises of the Institut de Formation des Métiers de l'Industrie Automobile (IFMIA) inaugurated in 2012; 6,500 employees have already been trained.





This activity zone covers a land base of 300 hectares and is mainly focused on the automotive industry (equipment manufacturers, subcontractors and services associated with the sector).

Inaddition, its competitive advantages offer a major basis for development: a network of equipment manufacturers with a strong presence in the region, the proximity of Renault Tanger Med's site, a logistics system allowing for optimal connectivity and considerable regional potential.







This activity zone covers an area of 150 hectares adjacent to the expressway linking Tangier to Tetouan.

This project aims to develop an industrial and logistics park in the Tetouan region and complements the offer of Tanger Med industrial platform.

This area is dedicated to the establishment of industrial and logistics units targeting the regional market of Northern Morocco.

TETOUAN

This zone is dedicated to offshoring activities. Located in Tetouan and offers office space for activities such as ITO (Information Technology Outsourcing), BPO (Business Processing Outsourcing) and KPO (Knowledge Process Outsourcing).

Spread over an area of 6 hectares, the first phase of the park allowed for the development of 22,000 square metres of offices and service space.

EUROPEAN ASSEMBLY SITES

Products manufactured in Tanger Med industrial platform are intended for sourcing of assembly sites in Europe, such as: Vigo (Spain) for PSA, Barcelona (Spain) for VW, Valencia (Spain) for Ford and Valladolid (Spain) for Renault.

For example:

• Valeo produces lighting systems and windshield wipers at its industrial unit in Tangier Automotive City (TAC) and then the parts are exported to PSA Vigo at the rate of several exports per week.

Standard Profil, a producer of sealing parts,

- distributes its products to Renault Valladolid,
 VW in Martorell (Barcelona), and parts for the
 Seat Ibiza and Leon, as well as for the Audi A1.
- The American company Joyson Safety systems (Takata) produces steering wheels for Ford in Valencia at a rate of two trucks flows per week, and three flows to Barcelona for Seat.

The consolidation of flows between Standard Profil and Joyson Sayfety is carried out on a regular basis towards Barcelona.

• Lear, an American multinational company, manufactures and exports vehicle textile components to the assembly sites of Ford, Renault-Nissan and PSA in France and Spain.

THE YEAR 2019: ACHIEVEMENTS AND NEW CHALLENGES

1. Territorial dynamics driven by the Tanger Med structuring project

With the launching of Tanger Med port complex in 2003, the intervention area, which is rural in nature, has gradually experienced a great socio-economic dynamic at all levels. It is expressed through:

- •The creation of road, motorway and rail networks allowing the opening up of villages to the public transport,
- The creation of basic services and infrastructure (administrations, health centres, basic amenities, etc.),
- Urban development (construction of housing, relocation and resettlement, etc.),
- The growth of local trade and the creation of direct jobs (Integration of local residents, entrepreneurship, Income Generating Activities, local products, rental, etc.).

2. Remarkable progress in education

The calling for education is indeed Excellence. This is the reason why the Foundation has made this axis a priority from the start. It is constantly reflecting on how to provide answers to this question:

How can we contribute to improving the quality of education?

3.Large-scale basic infrastructure projects

Access to basic infrastructure and local services is one of the fundamentals of preserving equity and human dignity. It guarantees the satisfaction of the basic needs of the target populations and improves their quality of life.

Over the years, the Foundation has undertaken several territorial upgrading projects on several scales. These include program for connection to the drinking water network, development of roads and access to villages, relocation and re-housing of populations, construction and renovation of schools, health centres and socio-cultural centres, creation of tourist offers and environmental projects...

This year, efforts were focused on connecting villages to the drinking water network, which is a basic necessity.

The Foundation pays particular attention to socio-educational infrastructures, in this case those for early childhood, and has joined forces with various partners to undertake a vast program to build pre-school units in the Fahs Anjra Province.





4. Youth development program through art and culture

Art and education are complementary insofar as they serve pedagogical objectives. Tanger Med Foundation places great importance on artistic creativity and on opening students' minds to art as a mechanism for personal development and for the promotion of solidarity and coexistence.

The Foundation has launched 4 art workshops for the benefit of rural children. The pilot experiment, which had barely been launched, made it possible to nurture the creativity and imagination of small talents.

TANGER MED FOUNDATION IS ISO 9001 V2015 CERTIFIED

Tanger Med Foundation maintains the ISO 9001 Version 2015 certification after passing a renewal audit focused on the review of the processes and procedures implemented. 




TANGER MED 1ST PORT CAPACITY IN THE MEDITERRANEAN

Tanger Med 2 port represents the third phase of Tanger Med port complex development, additional to Tanger Med 1 and Passagers & Ro-ro port. It corresponds to an infrastructure public investment of 1,4 billion Dollars.

This new port includes two new container terminals with an additional capacity of 6 million TEU containers. It aims to strengthen the position of the Tanger Med port complex as a reference hub in Africa and worldwide for logistical flows and international trade, with a total capacity of more than 9 million containers.

Being Africa's leading port since 2017, Tanger Med has also become the leading port



capacity in the Mediterranean, and is committed to integrating the top 20 platforms worldwide.



APM TERMINALS, THE OPERATOR OF TC4

The world leader APM TERMINALS is developing the TC4 container terminal in the Tanger Med 2 port under a concession contract.

This is the second terminal operated by world leader AP Moller - Maersk at the port complex.

The TC4 terminal is dedicated to the first global maritime alliance led by Maersk Line. This terminal is the most innovative one in Africa, and incorporates the latest generation of container movement equipment.

The private investment is 1,1 billion Euro for the development, on the quays delivered by Tanger Med, of the container storage platforms, superstructures and terminal management equipment.

The terminal has a quay length of 2000 m, an area of 58.5 HA and equipped with 12 latest-generation cranes capable of accommodating the largest container ships in the world, 30 Shuttle Carriers as well as 42 ARMG's.

DEVELOPMENT PERSPECTIVES FOR THE 2025 HORIZON

Tanger Med will continue the momentum initiated by a new investment program of 9 billion Dhs.

This program includes projects for the extension of the port's processing capacity and the development of new facilitation zones for freight flows.

These projects aim to provide the logistical solutions needed to support the growth of Moroccan exports, particularly in the industrial and agricultural sectors, as well as to meet the expected growth of TIR (International road transport) truck flows, which are expected to reach 600 000 TIR trucks by 2025.

The Northern region of the Kingdom will experience a new dynamic and accelerated growth thanks to the ambitious new project of the Cité Mohammed 6 Tanger Tech, which development will be in perfect synergy with the port and logistics projects of Tanger Med.

INTERNATIONAL PRESS TRIPS ON THE SIDELINES OF THE OFFICIAL LAUNCH OF TANGER MED 2 PORT OPERATIONS

On the occasion of the official launch of Tanger Med 2 port operations, Tanger Med organised international press trips during the 28/6 to 15/07 period.

More than 157 journalists from 45 countries around the world visited Tanger Med port for the occasion. This was the opportunity for them to find out about the latest developments of this mega moroccan project, fruit of a royal vision. Tanger Med is the leading port in Africa and with the start of Tanger Med 2 port operations, it has become the 1st port capacity in the Mediterranean.

A very informative programme consisting of presentations, films and visits to the port facilities (Tanger Med 1 port, Passengers and Ro-Ro port and Tanger Med 2 port) was organised for international journalists.



MEMORANDUM OF ADVANCED COLLABORATION FOR THE IMPLEMENTATION OF TRADE AND PASSENGERS FACILITATION ACROSS THE STRAIT OF GIBRALTAR

HM King Mohammed VI and HM King Felipe VI presided on February 13th, 2019 in Rabat a signing ceremony for a memorandum of advanced collaboration between the Port Authority of Tanger Med and the Port Authority of Algeciras Bay as part of the visit made by the King of Spain to the Kingdom of Morocco.

The two port authorities are located on both sides of the Strait of Gibraltar which represents a central hub of maritime and logistics flows of goods and people between Morocco and Europe, and a major hub for global logistics flows.

In 2018, the flows crossing through the Tanger Med

OFFICIAL VISIT OF THE LUXEMBOURG ECONOMIC MISSION CHAIRED BY HRH THE CROWN GRAND DUKE OF LUXEMBOURG

A Luxembourg economic delegation on a mission to Morocco last September, led by HRH Hereditary Grand Duke of Luxembourg, accompanied by HRH Hereditary Grand Duchess, made a stopover on September 25th, 2019 at Tanger Med port. The



port amounted to 2 802 108 passengers and 326 773 Trucks.

The significant evolution of trade flows, expected to reach 600 000 trucks by 2025, is driven by both industrial and agricultural export dynamics. As a result, the two port authorities are implementing an adequate framework for facilitation of exchanges between Morocco and Europe.

The areas of collaboration are the following:

• Facilitation of commercial exchanges between the two ports by setting up the regulatory framework between the two port authorities and administrations concerned to ensure faster handling of goods and passenger flows,

• Exchange of data between the two ports through the dematerialization and digitization of all commercial and maritime information relating to the transit of passengers and goods including document processing and traceability,

This memorandum of collaboration marks a milestone for the development of Morocco - Europe logistics corridors for exporters, importers and passengers of both shores.







The operation took place safely and It is the result of the excellent coordination between the port's operation officer, the port authority's pilot and the container terminal which allowed for good time optimization at the stopouer and in terms of operations.

March 22nd, 2019 the bulk and general cargo terminal of Tanger Med port hosted the STOLT OCELOT ship for the export loading of 1 050 tons of bulk olive oil on behalf of the Conserves of Meknes towards the United States.


EXPORT OF 48 WIND BLADES DURING 1ST QUARTER 2019

TANGER MED LAUNCHES THE MULTICHANNEL ONLINE PAYMENT FEATURES ON THE TANGER MED SERVICES PORTAL

As part of its service digitization program dedicated to the logistics community, Tanger Med has set up a new multichannel payment service, allowing operators to pay their bills in dirham for the crossing of the Freight port.

This new payment method offers operators the possibility to pay their bills through the following various channels:

- E-banking (payment on the bank's website)
- M-banking (mobile payment)
 GAB (Automated Teller Machine)

Operators wishing to use this new product must access to the Tanger Med portal and select a basket of credits that they plan to pay. A payment code is automatically assigned to the basket in question. It will be used by the operator to make the payment through the various channels offered.

Once the payment transaction is confirmed, the corresponding payment is recorded and the bills in question are paid.
The operators wishing to benefit from this new product must have, if not already, an account on the Tanger Med portal. For that, the attached form must be served and filed from Tanger Med's billing service who will process it.

DEMATERIALIZATION OF FREIGHT TRANSIT ON TANGER MED SERVICES PORTAL

Tanger Med pursues improvements related to the facilitation through dematerialization and automation of procedures.

Freight companies can now complete administrative tasks related to the port crossing at Tanger Med through the online declaration and electronic filing of documents for the port authority. In addition to the wider dematerialization of customs declarations, these companies will benefit from a simplification of their procedures and a high level of security for their goods flows:



Tanger Med has treated in 2018 near 2 million tonnes of products exported by truck and 8 million tonnes of products per container transshipped.


Tanger Med is at the service of Moroccan agricultural exports. The port offers an infrastructure dedicated



to the export of 19 HA composed of several spaces (administrative buildings, living spaces, warehouses, excavation platforms, temperature-controlled physical inspection area (cold positive / negative), double scanner tunnel, sentry boxes and checkpoints ...). The zone can process up to 2100 freight units per day. It allows a dematerialization of the export procedure, fluidity of the treatment of the export truck traffic as well as transit time in 2H.

The Tanger Med logistics zone includes a refrigeration unit with a surface area of 5,500 m² and a storage capacity of 35 000 m3 / 5 500 SKU dedicated to storage, preservation, labeling, packaging and light processing of agro-food products.

The multimodality of roro and maritime (by reefer) transport offers multiple solutions for exports. Finally, maritime connectivity to 186 ports and 77 countries allows Tanger Med to reach northern Europe in 3 days, North and South America in 10 days and China in 20 days.







TANGER MED PROVIDES SPECIAL ARRANGEMENTS FOR MARHABA 2019 OPERATION

The aim of Marhaba 2019 was to improve passengers comfort and optimize the transit time through the Tanger Med port to ensure safe and secure crossing.

As a result, several new facilities were put in operations to improve the flow of vehicles upon arrival and departure from Morocco. In this sense, a bridge allowing the physical separation of passenger vehicle flows and cargo was built for a budget of 25 million dirhams.

In addition, eight new sanitary blocks have built at registration and pre-boarding areas as well as children's playgrounds, while assistance services for people with special needs and human resources have strengthened.

In addition, the port authority released the new version of the website in three languages (French, Arabic, English) www.tangermedpassagers.ma and its mobile application. The platform has allowed travellers to be informed about traffic forecasts in order to better organise their crossing and travel with total peace of mind, obtain the boats departure and arrival schedules and other useful informations.

Other communication tools such as the toll-free number, social media, Tanger Med radio, SMS alerts... have remained operational and available to travellers for continuous information on travel forecasts and the port's situation.

During the 2019 campaign, Tanger Med port was connected to the ports of Algeciras, Motril, Barcelona, Genoa, Sauona and Sete. The fleet plan that was deployed consisted of 12 ships with a backing ship during peak periods on the Tanger Med - Algesiras line with a capacity of nearly 43,000 passengers and 10,000 cars a day.

During the arrival phase, a peak was recorded on 3rd to 4th August weekend corresponding to the arrival of 61,197 passengers and 15,601 vehicles. For the return phase, the very busy period from 28th to 31th August recorded a total traffic at exit of 112,202 passengers and 23,494 vehicles with a peak on August 28th of 34,283 passengers and 7,535 vehicles at Morocco exit.

The waiting times recorded during this very busy period did not exceed an average of two hours.

Tanger Med's results of the 2019 Marhaba operation reached a total transit of 1,544,553 passengers, 439 491 vehicles and 2,935 coaches.

The Marhaba 2019 campaign launched on June 5th and closed on September 15th was conducted in good conditions, thanks to the involvement of all the operation's stakeholders, particularly the local authorities, the DGSN, the Customs, the sanitary control at borders, the gendarmerie and the local authority, with the coordination of the Mohammed V Foundation for Solidarity.



TANGER MED STRENGTHENS ITS SERVICE OFFERING TO PASSENGERS BY OPENING A NEW HOTEL OPERATED BY ONOMO

As part of the ongoing efforts to improve the comfort and travel conditions of passengers passing through the port, especially during Marhaba period which entails an important traffic passengers, Tanger Med port is strengthening its passenger infrastructure by opening an ONOMO hotel, in the port complex.

This new hotel is located in the multimodal building «Tanger Med Port Center», comprising both a ferry terminal, a railway station and a coach station, thus allowing accommodating train, coach or vehicle passengers.

With a private investment of 35 million dirhams, ONOMO Hotel Tanger Med spreads over a total area of nearly 4200 m² on 2 levels. It has 94 rooms and a capacity of 140 beds.









SEWS STARTS ITS ACTIVITY AT

The Japanese group, SEWS, specialising in the automotive industry, has chosen to set up its distribution hub within Tanger Med Logistics Zone through the 3PL BOLLORE LOGISTICS.

This new logistics platform will serve as an african redistribution hub for products coming from China, Japan, Hungary and the USA.



DELIVERY OF 2 NEW RTG TO TC2 OF TANGER MED PORT

The operator of the container terminal (TC2) Eurogate Tangier has reinforced its handling cranes (RTG). Two new RTGs were delivered during the month of August 2019, they will have a lifting capacity of 50 tons and will increase the performance and processing capacity of import/export volumes.

GATE ACCESS: FULL INTEGRATION WITH CUSTOMS SYSTEM

Tanger Med Zones as a logistics and industrial platform integrated into a performant port platform, provide logistics operators with better competitiveness in terms of distribution chain management (freight cost, port handling, transit time...), quality infrastructures, and integrated logistics with the best international standards. This logistical integration, which meets the fluidity, traceability and security requirements of logistics flows, is based on the use of the GATE ACCESS system allowing the following:

 Management and traceability of goods entering/ exiting the free zones





- Management and traceability of inter / intrazone flows,
- Possibility of extracting relevant statistics on goods flows.
- Reliability and transparency of information exchanges with the different stakeholders (Free zones, Port, Logistics operators, Customs, etc.),
- Cooperation with customs services in the port and free zones.

GATE ACCESS system experienced a major evolution during the last quarter, enabling the process of dematerialization and fluidification of freight unit handling to be accelerated by the automatic integration of the customs declaration (DUM) of flows coming from and to Tanger Med Zones.

DIGITALIZATION IN TANGER MED: A NEW STEP FORWARD FOR AGRI-BUSINESS EXPORTS

In the framework of the dematerialization of Tanger Med's service offer through the implementation in its portal «Port Community System» of various solutions to strengthen the logistic competitiveness of exporters, a new milestone has just been reached thanks to the partnership with Morocco Foodex for the facilitation of Moroccan exports of agri-food products.

This new solution will allow a dematerialized management of agri-good's export process, according to the requirements of Morocco Foodex, from the product packaging, storage and manufacturing stations throughout the Kingdom.

For instance, an exporter of citrus fruits from the Agadir





region, will be able, thanks to his access accounts in Morocco Foodex portal or in «Tanger Med Port Community System» to apply for the certification of compliance of his products for export, to consult the control results issued by Morocco Foodex, and to generate in a dematerialized way the inspection certificate of his exports, all from his production site.

Thanks to the automated exchange with control bodies

and border crossing points, including the BADR system of the Customs and Indirect Taxes Administration, the inspection certificate can be automatically sent to obtain the customs clearance for shipment through Tanger Med

This solution confirms Tanger Med's ongoing commitment to improving the logistics competitiveness of Moroccan exporters.

INFORMATION DAY FOR AGRIBUSINESS AND TRANSPORT COMPANIES IN THE SOUSSMASSA-DRAÂ REGION

Tanger Med organized on October 31th, 2019 in Agadir, an information day for agri-business and transport companies in the Souss-Massa-Daraâ region, under the theme: «Dematerialization, an important project at the heart of Tanger Med's strategy».

The objective of this day was to present the new digital services implemented by Tanger Med for the benefit of the port community. As part of the dematerialization project of Tanger Med's offer, these services mainly aim at improving customer service, the competitiveness of Moroccan exporters and contribute strongly to the development of the Supply Chain and the evolution of the transport activity in Morocco and on the international scene.

During that day, exporters of agricultural products from the Agadir region attended presentations on several digital solutions, including



the dematerialization of port passage procedures and maritime traffic, the solution for connecting carriers and shipping companies to improve the reservation process of Ro-Ro cargo at Tanger Med and the multichannel payment.

This meeting was also an opportunity to present the solution with Morocco Foodex for the facilitation of Moroccan exports of agri-food products. This partnership focuses mainly on the digitalization of the technical control service through interaction with exporters and other control bodies via Tanger Med Port Community System.

At the end of the day's programme, Tanger Med representatives presented the project for the development of a logistics platform for fruit and vegetable promotion at the autonomous port of Abidjan within the framework of an agreement signed between Morocco and Côte d'Ivoire. The aim is to better promote the flows exchanged between the two countries, as well as with other countries of the sub-region. The project involves investments in the construction of temperature and atmosphere controlled logistics warehouses as well as exhibition and promotion.



KONECRANES HAS WON AN ORDER FOR T16 RUBBER TYRED GANTRIES (RTG) FOR THE CONTAINERS TERMINAL (TC3) OF TANGER MED 2 PORT

In November 2019, Konecranes won an order from Tanger Alliance/TC3 for 16 Rubber Tired Gantries (RTG) with a lifting capacity of 40 tonnes, lifting containers 1-over-5 high and 7 container rows wide plus truck lane.

The new RTG will be equipped with the Auto-steering feature and Auto-TOS Reporting.

According to KONECRANES, This order will be delivered to containers terminal (TC3) by mid-July 2020.

AEGEAN now operates under the name of MINERVA Bunkering, a 100% subsidiary of MERCURIA, one of the largest private companies in the energy and commodities sector.

Minerva Bunkering started its activities at Tanger Med port in the 4th quarter of 2019 and aims to capture more traffic in order to position Tanger Med port as a strategic bunkering player in the Strait of Gibraltar.

ORGANIZATION OF THE 2ND AFRICAN CONGRESS OF MARITIME PILOTS ACMP 2019

The Mediterranean Professional Association of Maritime Pilots (APMPM) organised jointly with AMPA (African Maritime Pilots' Association) and IMPA (International Maritime Pilots' Association) the second African Maritime Pilots' Congress ACMP2019 under the theme: «Maritime piloting, between challenges and adaptation for the port development of an emerging Africa».

In partnership with Tanger Med, the event was organised from 14 to 16 October at the Tanger Med Port Centre and was attended by more than 200 speakers over 2 days. TI Automotive will install a fuel system and fuel additive manufacturing plant at Tanger Automotive City for an investment of € 16 million on a 17,000 m² area. Eventually, the plant will create nearly 267 jobs.

MARTUR FOMPACK GROUP SETS UP AT TANGER AUTOMOTIVE CITY

Founded in 1985 and one of the largest producers of car seats in the world, the Turkish group MARTUR FOMPACK has decided to set up on a Tanger Med building in Tangier Automotive city with a surface of 20 000 m² with about an investment of 10 million euros that will ensure the creation of 695 jobs.



SIGNATURE OF AN AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE FACULTY OF SCIENCES AND EVERIS TETOUAN SHORE

The Faculty of Sciences of Tetouan and the Spanish-Japanese holding company of the multinational «Everis Morocco» offshoring, located in Tetouan Shore, have signed an agreement for the long-term recruitment of 300 laureates.

Signed by the Faculty's Dean, Abdellatif Moukrim and the General Manager of Everis Morocco Fred Sabbah. the agreement provides for the launch of a training program that leads to the hiring of the first promotion of 25 laureates from the Faculty, within the framework of the Hispano-Japanese giant's expansion plan.

Part of the multinational «NTT Data Company», Everis is positioned in the top 10 international IT services companies, with 70 000 employees across 15 countries and a turnover of 700 million Euros. 





NATIONAL PROGRAM «ECOLOGICAL SCHOOLS»

The Tanger Med Foundation supported this year several primary schools in the framework of the national program «Ecological Schools» in partnership with the Mohammed VI Foundation for the environment and the Provincial Directorates of National Education.

Today, 7 schools have the Green Flag label thanks to the efforts of all the stakeholders including students.

These actions have led to a real awareness of environmental issues among the youngest populations. The emphasis has been placed on good environmental practices in sustainability (Preservation of natural resources, renewable energies, recycling and waste management, solidarity actions...).

With the support of teachers and the involvement of the directorates, the programme contributes to the improvement of school results and acts on the personal development of pupils.

DALIA'S CLEAN BEACH PROGRAM - 2019

Since 2015 and in parallel with Tanger Med Group's environmental approach, the Tanger Med Foundation has been taking care of Dalia beach as part of the national «Clean Beaches» program initiated by the Mohammed VI Foundation for the Protection of the Environment.

The program includes the development of the beach, the installation of sanitation and leisure facilities, cleaning and waste management equipment in addition to environmental awareness actions carried out during the summer season. The beach has been labelled «Blue Flag» since 2016 as recognition of the efforts put in by all stakeholders.

This program enables to offer a job to over 150 young people



from Ksar Al Majaz municipality during the summer season from June 15th to September 15th of every year.

Teams comprising instructors, health assistants, lifeguards, security agents, cleaning agents... are mobilised throughout the season for a clean beach. Among them, several students from the region volunteer and therefore benefit from this opportunity to finance their university studies.

UNDERWATER SEABED CLEANING CAMPAIGN - DALIA

As part of its sustainable development strategy, the Tanger Med Foundation has supported the Fnideq Champions Association for underwater fishing in the organisation of the 2nd edition of the underwater seabed cleaning campaign for the Dalia coastline, Ksar Al Majaz municipality in preparation for the 2019 summer season.



The action mobilised more than 300 people, including 100 divers, who worked to extract plastic and organic waste and the remains of fishing nets.

Some 120 children came to benefit from awareness workshops.

PROGRAM FOR THE CONNECTION OF DRINKING WATER NETWORK OF TANGER MED NEIGHBOURING VILLAGES TO THE PORT COMPLEX

After a first experience that generated great satisfaction among the population of Dalia and El Haoumma villages, the Foundation is launching, in partnership with the Fahs Anjra Province, the rural municipalities and the ONEE, a program for the connection to the drinking water network of the Tanger Med's neighbouring villages, on a radius of 7 Km around the complex.

The program is spread over 2 phases and will benefit more than 1,023 households in 17 villages in the municipalities of Ksar Al Majaz and Taghramt.



CONSTRUCTION OF LOUYED MOSQUE

The Tanger Med Foundation has signed a partnership agreement with the Ministry of Habous and Islamic Affairs for the construction of the Louyed mosque in Ksar Al Majaz municipality.

With a budget estimated at 5.2 M dhs, the project includes the demolition and reconstruction of the mosque that will start in July.



#B7ARBLAPLASTIC: A COLLECTIVE MOBILISATION AGAINST PLASTIC WASTE

This summer, the Tanger Med Foundation focused its programme on the national campaign "A plastic-free sea" or "b7ar bla plastic" in partnership with the Mohammed VI Foundation for the protection of the environment.

The campaign aims to mobilise a maximum of young people, especially children, against the pollution of the seas and oceans by plastic waste.



DISABLED PEOPLE PROGRAM: ENJOY THE BEACH SAFELY

This year, Tanger Med
Foundation has implemented
a program to support disabled
people and facilitate their
access to the beach in the best
conditions combining pleasure
and safety.

The program includes the following aspects:

Infrastructure giving access to water with ramps and guardrails allowing autonomous swimming under the constant supervision of instructors;

- Parking reserved for vehicles belonging to people with special needs
- Umbrellas reserved for people with special needs
- Sanitary services for people with special needs



- 4 main accesses with walkways to facilitate traffic
- Wheelchairs and amphibious chairs Mobilization of a team of specially trained instructors to support disabled people from the car park to the facilities and during the bathing time.

The program has been very popular with the international press, indeed it focused on a vulnerable category of people who do not have access to the beach and is deprived of any seaside activity. Many national and international media

covered the programme such as Al Jazeera, Al Hurra, Al Ghad Al Mochrek, Dijlah TV, France 24, Euronews, SBS News, and VRT News. The programme has been widely shared on social networks generating more than 3 million views.

By collaborating with local associations in this programme, Tanger Med Foundation has set up an inspiring model for the inclusion of people with special needs.

TANGER MED'S AWARD FOR EXCELLENCE

As part of the 6th edition of the Tanger Med Grand Prix for Excellence, the Foundation rewarded the best graduates of the intervention area.

During the award ceremony of the Tanger Med's Award for Excellence, a review of the educational projects implemented by the various strategic partners in the area was presented.

With the launch of Tanger Med

port in 2003 and thanks to the mobilisation and involvement of the various stakeholders (Regional Academy of Education and Training of Tangier-Tetouan, Fahs Anjra Province, local communities, local authorities, parent and guardian associations of students, APDN and Tanger Med Foundation...), the education sector has experienced a significant improvement in Fahs Anjra Province:





- Provincial Directorate MEN Fahs Anjra ranked 1st regional and 2nd national (2018-19)
- 94%: Success rate for baccalaureate exams (2018-19)
- 97%: Success rate of girls in baccalaureate exams (2018-19)
- Overall average grades for the Baccalaureate in evolution: More than 17/20 (2018-19)

- 100%: Success rate in Dar Taleb and Dar Al Fatate (2018-19) centers
- Increasing involvement of student's parents in school life
- Clear improvement of school infrastructures
- Strengthened extracurricular activities for the personal development of students.

TANGER MED'S AWARD OF FINE ARTS

On July 26th, Tanger Med Foundation awarded the Tanger Med's Award of Fine arts to the best students-artists of the National Institute of Fine Arts majoring in comics, plastic arts and design.





COMPETITION FOR IDEAS FOR THE TANGER MED'S AWARD FOR EXCELLENCE

Tanger Med Foundation works to promote art among young people and support studentsartists in their conduct of artistic projects.

Mr Yassine HMICHANE is the winning student of the competition who has managed to best promote the vocation of Excellence.

The announcement of the competition's results took place during the award ceremony of the Tanger Med's Award for Excellence.





BLOOD DONATION OPERATION -TETOUAN SHORE

The Tanger Med Foundation helped to organise a blood donation operation in Tetouan Shore, a division of the Tanger Med Group, the Tetouan Blood Transfusion Centre and the Sourire Association of blood donors. The donors are mainly employees of companies installed in the park in addition to the students from the Institute Specialised in Offshoring Trades (ISMO).





DISTRIBUTION OF TEXTBOOKS AND SCHOOL SUPPLIES M'DIQ-FNIDEQ PREFECTURE

The Foundation has contributed in collaboration with the Association of Former Students of Lycée Fkih Daoud to the distribution of textbooks and school supplies operation for the benefit of middle and high school students of the M'diq-Fnideq prefecture for the start of the school year 2019-2020.

Over 400 school boys and girls have benefited from the donation to date. This action helps students from disadvantaged backgrounds who find it difficult to continue their studies.



DALIA BEACH LIBRARY AWARDED THE "LALLA HASNAA TROPHY FOR A SUSTAINABLE COASTLINE"

On November 13th, 2019, at the Hassan II International Environmental Training Centre in Bouknadel, the award ceremony for the 3rd edition of the Lalla Hasnaa Sustainable Coastline Trophies was held under the presidency of Her Royal Highness Princess Lalla Hasnaa.

The Dalia Beach Library was awarded as one of the best national initiatives taken for the protection of the coastline under the category of «Education and Youth».

The Dalia Beach Library is a public reading space open to summer visitors. The environmental awareness workshops, as well as the books and encyclopaedias dealing with ecological phenomena, have made the Library a prime space for exchange and environmental education.

It should be remembered that from its inception, the library has been particularly popular with the general public and through the world press.

As usual, at the end of each summer season, all the books were donated on behalf of schools.





PROGRAMME TO SUPPORT THE SOCIOPROFE-SSIONAL INTEGRATION OF PEOPLE WITH SPECIAL NEEDS

In line with the Tanger Med Group's CSR strategy, the Tanger Med Foundation launched this year a programme to support the socioprofessional integration of people with special needs.

The programme provides support for people with special needs through discovery and socialization internships within Tanger Med group. This immersion will enable young trainees to gain autonomy and open up to the workplace.

To this day, two partnership contracts have been signed with associations in the region to accompany 2 interns (Deafmute and Down's syndrome).

Tanger Med Foundation is currently reflecting on how to expand this approach through the group's various subsidiaries and to raise awareness among economic operators located in Tanger Med's different activity zones.



ART WORKSHOPS: FOR THE PERSONAL DEVELOPMENT OF CHILDREN

After a first experience in 2018-19, Tanger Med Foundation has agreed to expand its action dedicated to the personal development of children through art with the launch of 8 art workshops in schools in the zone.

Through workshops dedicated to choir, Andalusian singing, painting, reading/writing and theatre, a space of discovery and development is created for children. In addition to the school, supervision by art professionals and collaboration with local associations allow the pupils to benefit from an approved educational approach and to discover their passion for art.

At the same time, Tanger Med Foundation has signed a partnership agreement with Mohammed VI Foundation for the Promotion of Social Works of education and training on a programme aimed at integrating students from the Khmiss Anjra Commune into the artistic workshops of the Tetouan Sociocultural Centre.

The partnership aims to facilitate access to art and culture for the children of the commune by benefiting from the socio-cultural structures and artistic offers present in the region.





HOSPITALITY CENTER: DAR AL FATATE MELLOUSSA

Tanger Med Foundation responded positively to the pressing request of the Melloussa Charity Association to renovate the obsolete buildings of the Dar Al Fatate Hospitality Centre in Melloussa.

Indeed, the Tanger Med
Foundation undertook the
project of fitting out and
equipping all Dar Al Fatate
facilities in order to guarantee
the start of the school year
and the accommodation of
140 young girls in the best
possible conditions.

In addition to equipment, the project included the following work: waterproofing, plumbing, window and door repairs, wall covering and painting, etc.





ECO-SCHOOLS: THE EMERGENCE OF A C O M M I T T E D A N D R E S P O N S I B L E COMMUNITY

This year, Tanger Med
Foundation has supported
Aghattass, Bni Hlou, Bni
Ouassine and Al Yassamine
schools in their «Ecological
Schools» projects in
partnership with Mohammed
VI Foundation for the
Protection of the Environment
and the Provincial
Directorates of National
Education.

Thanks to the efforts deployed, the 4 schools are today labelled "Green Flag". The involvement of students and the commitment of teachers reveal a progressive awareness of environmental issues among the new generation.

With this new acknowledgement, the number of schools awarded with the support of Tanger Med Foundation has risen from 3 to 7 schools in the intervention area.



PLATFORM FOR THE PROFESSIONAL INTEGRATION OF YOUNG PEOPLE FROM FAHS ANJRA

The professional integration of young people is one of the areas to which the Foundation pays particular attention.

A partnership agreement has been signed with the Fahs Anjra Province and the National Agency for the Promotion of Employment and Skills ANAPEC for the creation of a platform dedicated to the support of young people from the Fahs Anjra Province in search of employment.

The platform has opened its doors to young people looking for work: Integration into the local job market or entrepreneurship (self-employment, incomegenerating activities ...).

Tanger Med Foundation took charge of the platform's development and equipment work and mobilized an operating budget for a period of 2 years.



2019 PORT ACTIVITY REPORT

THANKS TO TANGER MED 2, THE PORT COMPLEX REACHES A NEW MILESTONE WITH MORE THAN 4.8 MILLION CONTAINERS GROWING BY +38%, AND MORE THAN 65 MILLION TONS HANDLED.

CONTAINER TRAFFIC UP BY + 38%

Following the operational start of Tanger Med 2 port, a total number of **4 801 713 TEU*** containers were handled at the port complex during the year 2019, representing an exceptional progression of + **38%** compared with the same period in 2018.

VEHICLE TRAFFIC: THE 500 000 THRESHOLD OF NEW VEHICLES HANDLED IS REACHED

500 465 vehicles were handled on the two vehicle terminals of Tanger Med port in 2019, representing a growth of + 5% compared to the previous year. The figure includes: 380,784 Renault vehicles, of which 349,050 are for exports, and 112,857 vehicles handled at the common user terminal.

The year 2019 was marked by the start of PSA vehicle exports through Tanger Med port from the Kenitra plant.

TRUCKS TRAFFIC INCREASES

357,214 trucks were handled in 2019 at Tanger Med port, a growth of **+9%** compared to 2018. Exports are mainly driven by industrial and agrifood products.

PASSENGER TRAFFIC REMAINED STABLE

Passenger activity remained stable during 2019 with a transit of **2,775,402** passengers (-1%) and 697,324 vehicles (+1%) compared to 2018.

LIQUID AND SOLID BULK TRAFFIC ON RISE

Liquid bulk traffic grew by +7% compared to 2018. It recorded a total traffic of 6,349,154 tons of hydrocarbons handled. Solid bulk traffic recorded a total of 258,340 tons handled, an increase of +2%, mainly due to the traffic of steel coils and wind turbine blades.

GROWING SHIP TRAFFIC

In 2019, **14,305** ships called at Tanger Med port, up **+7%** compared to 2018. Thanks to the implementation of an optimised ship call management system, Tanger Med port welcomed nearly 800 mega-ships (over +299 metres in size), up by **+9.9%** compared to the previous year.

NEW FACILITIES IN THE PORT LOGISTICS ZONE

In 2019, **10** new operators have started their activity in the Tanger Med port logistics zone, including international players such as DHL, NIPPON EXPRESS, and KASAI.

All of these achievements confirm Tanger Med's position as the prime platform serving the Moroccan economy and as a major logistics hub for global trade

- 6,4 billion USD for the automotive sector, up 4% compared to 2017, linked to the performances recorded by the sector thanks to the combined evolutions of Renault Tanger Med exports and manufacturer sourcing (Renault, Ford, PSA,..)
- 1,4 billion USD for the dedicated Logistical Zone

• **700 million USD** for other industrial sectors, notably textiles and aeronautics

In terms of logistics flows created (including trucks and containers), they also increased by 7.5% and amounted to 304 224 units in 2019 (compared to 281 491 units in 2018) across all the activity zones of Tanger Med industrial platform


NEW PRIVATE INVESTMENTS

The year 2019 was marked by the setting up of 125 new projects in all of Tanger Med's activity zones, which represent private investments of 510 million USD and 11 570 new jobs.

These projects include in particular the Indian group Varroc Lighting Systems, a world leader in automotive lighting systems, the French group Valeo, the Martur Fompack group, one of the main producers of car seats

in the world, TE Connectivity, world leader in sensor and connectivity solutions, and the German group ContiTech.

To date, Tanger Med's activity zones totals 1000 companies on a developed area of 2 000 ha and operating in more than 10 different industrial sectors.



Port activities, turnover growth of 18%



Industrial activities, 5% decrease in turnover




